SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

This show is conducted in accordance with the rules of the Welsh Pony & Cob Society of America. Each participant in this show is responsible for the knowledge of and is subject to these rules.

- 1. Eligibility:** All Ponies/Cobs must be registered in the studbook of the Welsh Pony & Cob Society of America, or, if under one year, be eligible for registration. A Pony/Cob must be shown under its full registered Welsh name and number. All lease agreements must be officially recorded through the Society office. All recorded leases are designated as such on the animal's Certificate of Registration. Leased animals being shown must present a copy of registration listing the lessee.
- 2. Measurement:** All halter animals 6 years and over, and all performance animals must present a copy of a WPCSA or USEF permanent measurement card or measurement conducted during the current competition year, or be measured. Measurement to Thursday at 1PM—3PM or by appointment
- 3. Exhibitors, parents and/or guardians of minor exhibitors** shall indemnify and hold harmless the Welsh Pony and Cob Association, Southwest Welsh Exhibitors and LA County Fairgrounds Fairgrounds, their officers, employees and/or all horse show officials and employees from any and all liability resulting in injury and/or loss sustained by any person, child or ward of such parent/guardian, in any manner occasioned.
- 4. Entries:** Copy of BOTH sides of the registration papers MUST accompany each entry. If you have a current measurement card, include a copy of it. Exhibitor numbers will not be issued until ALL paperwork is in order, and any measuring required has been completed. PLEASE take the time to fill out your entry form correctly and completely.
- 5. Driving: For animals in harness, animals must be fully bridled while hitching and unhitching. Removing the bridle from an animal harnessed to a vehicle, or leaving an animal unattended while hitched, anywhere on the show grounds, will result in instant elimination and removal from the show grounds.**
- 6. All riders in any class where jumping is required and/or when jumping anywhere on the show grounds, must wear protective headgear.** ALL JUNIORS must wear properly fitted headgear with chin harness secured, at all times whenever mounted or in a driven vehicle at all times on the show ground. Anyone violating this rule will be prohibited from further riding until in compliance. NOTE: Protective headgear is advised and welcome in all classes of any age group, with no judging penalties.
- 7. Stake Classes:** To qualify for entry, exhibitors must enter and compete in at least one other class in the division. All stake/jackpot will pay \$30 to first place, \$20 to second place. Classes with less than 3 entries: \$20 to first place.
- 8. Post Entry Rules:** Post entries and changes will only be accepted up to the end of the previous session. Pre-entries are strongly encouraged.
- 9. All dogs must be on leash or secured at all times.**
- 10. Juniors are NOT allowed to show or handle stallions anywhere on the fairgrounds.**
- 11. Payment of Fees:** A completed and signed check must accompany entries. Returned checks will be subject to a \$25 fee and must be cleared within 30 days of the last day of the show, or disciplinary actions will be sought through the WPCSA. Refund Policy: No refunds will be given unless a class is canceled, or upon presentation of a Vet Certificate or Doctor's note. The Show Committee's discretion will be used in other instances. **Decisions of Show Management are final.**
- 12. ANY** abuse toward any animal or Show Official/Staff will be cause for immediate ejection from the show and premises, **WITHOUT REFUND.**
- 13. Management reserves unto itself the right** to refuse or cancel any entries, disqualify riders, drivers or exhibitors without incurring claim for damages. Classes will be split where entries warrant. Decisions of the Show Management are final.
- 14. Two (2) Minute Gate Rule:** To be strictly enforced. Additional three (3) minutes will be allowed for requested tack change. The Gate will not be held for more than five (5) minutes.
- 15. Wire Wheeled vehicles** will be allowed in WPCSA Carriage Driving and WPCSA Pleasure Driving classes.

17. **PRIZES:** Ribbons 1st to 5th place. Awards to 1st place. Ribbons to Supreme & Division Champions.
18. **GELDING INCENTIVE:** The Holiday Warm-Up is a single point show and the Holiday Welsh Classic is a double point show for the West Coast Fall Circuit Gelding Incentive Program. All geldings are eligible to be nominated. Contact Carol Maurer (714) 777-1784 or Carol@southwestwelsh.com for details and nomination info.
19. **JACKPOT HIGHPOINT:** Hi-points will be awarded as follows:
- a. **Categories:**
 - i. Section A pony
 - ii. Section B pony
 - iii. Section C
 - iv. Section D
 - v. ½ Welsh
 - vi. 12 & Under - One pony or cob/exhibitor
 - vii. 13-17 – One pony or cob/exhibitor
 - viii. Adult Rider – One pony or cob/exhibitor
 - b. **Pay back** – 100% of high-point fees collected for each category will be awarded to the highest scoring individual nominated for that category. The Holiday Welsh show will guarantee a minimum per category award amount of \$25.
 - c. **Eligible classes-** All classes from both shows to count
20. **DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIPS:** In case of a tie, (except hunter) it shall be settled by ride/drive off. In case of a tie in the hunter division, the championship or reserve will be awarded to the animal that accumulated the most points over fences. If animals have an equal number of points over fences, they must be shown at a walk, trot and canter using the same judging specifications as in the classes offered in the division. No championship points can be awarded in any division unless all three of the scheduled classes in that division have been held. All three of the WPCSA division classes must have three or more exhibitors showing in each class for championship points to be awarded. Points for championships will be calculated as follows for all performance divisions: 1st – 5 points, 2nd – 3 points, 3rd - 2 points, 4th – 1 point.

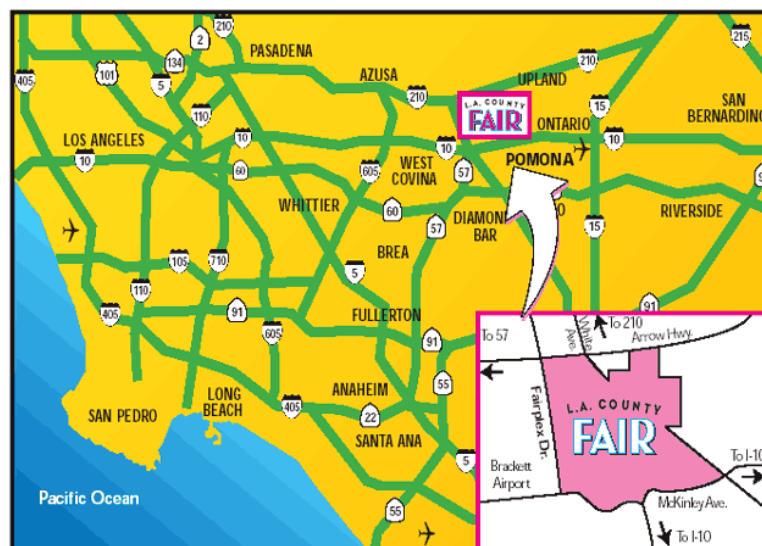
From the 210 West (Foothill freeway)...

Class Specifications

WPCSA BREED CLASSES (Article 110.2)

Animals are to be shown in hand at a walk and a trot except in group classes. Purebred Welsh to be judged 85% on breed type, conformation, **way of going, quality and substance and 15% on disposition and manners. Natural reaching action is desired. Half-Welsh to be judged 85% on conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on Welsh breed type, disposition and manners.**

WPCSA WELSH ENGLISH PLEASURE (Article 112.3)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring on light contact without martingale. To be judged 75% on performance, manners movement and style; 25 % on breed type and conformation. Working classes to be judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA WELSH WESTERN PLEASURE (Article 112.4)

To be shown at a walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring without martingale on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. To be judged on performance, with emphasis on manners 65%; on breed type, movement and conformation 25%; appointments 10%. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA WELSH HUNTER (Article 112.5)

Over fences(o/f): To be shown over a course of a minimum of eight fences of the required height. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes judged 100% on performance. Animals not exceeding 13.2 hands will jump 2'0", animals exceeding 13.2 but not over 14.2 hands shall jump 2'6". Animals exceeding 14.2 hands jump 2'9". Under saddle (u/s): To be eligible, pony must have shown in and completed an over fences class. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. **May be required to gallop one way of the ring, but no more than eight animals at one time.**

WPCSA SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER (Article 112.6)

Division is open to riders 12 years and under. Classes are open to all ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Riders in this division may not compete over fences in any other division except short Stirrup equitation. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. May either trot or canter the entire course. Over-fence classes must precede the under-saddle class. To be judged 100% on performance. To be eligible for the under-saddle class, pony must be entered and complete a course in at least one over-fence class. Under-saddle class animals shown both ways of ring at a walk, trot and canter.

WPCSA PLEASURE DRIVING (Article 113.1)

To be shown to a suitable two or four-wheeled vehicle or four-wheeled vehicle for pairs, but not a viceroy, racing sulky or fine harness rig. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, working trot and trot on and stand quietly and except for tandems, **to back readily.** To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA CARRIAGE DRIVING (Article 113.2)

(wire wheeled vehicles can be used if stated in prize list.) In addition to the gaits detailed in the pleasure driving section (Article 113.1), carriage driving also requires the slow trot which is slower and more collected but not to the degree required in the dressage collected trot. The animal should indicate a willingness to be driven on the bit while maintaining a steady cadence. Turnout to be judged 40% on performance, manners and way of going; 30% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle; 15% on neatness and appropriateness of attire; and 15% on overall impression. Working class to be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going; 20% on condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire. Obstacle/Cones to be Judged 100% on performance. Rules for obstacle/cones need to be added to prize list. Carriage Driving Working Pattern/Test to be judged 60% on execution of test or pattern, 20% on manners and way of going, 20% on condition and fit of harness, vehicle and neatness of attire.

WPCSA SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION (Article 114.1)

Over Fences (o/f): Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of four fences with eight jumping efforts required. Animals may either trot or canter the entire course. The o/f class must precede the u/s class. Under saddle (u/s): Division is open to riders 12 years & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. To be judged 100% on hands, seat, control and suitability of mount. Riders in this division may not compete over fences in any other division except Short Stirrup Hunter. Animals must walk, trot and canter.

WPCSA HUNTER SEAT EQUITATION (Article 114.3 2/114.4 3)

Classes open to ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Over Fence classes to be shown over a minimum of six obstacles. To be judged on the rider's appearance, seat, hands and control of their mount. Under saddle classes to be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Tests may be required.

WPCSA STOCK SEAT EQUITATION (Article 114.3 2/114.5)

Classes are open to ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Riders to be judged on seat, hands, performance of animal, appointments of animal and rider and suitability of animal to rider. Riders enter the ring at a walk or jog and are judged at a flat-footed four beat walk, two-beat jog and a three-beat lope both ways of the ring. All competitors are required to back a straight line during the line up. Tests may be required.

WPCSA LEADING REIN (Article 115.1)

Section A or B, C or Half-Welsh, mare or gelding, 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitors at least four, but not more than eight, years of age. The leading rein to be attached to the cavesson on the English bridle and on the Western bridle to the cheek slot of the bit (top of the bit) while leaving control of the pony to the child. No chain leadlines allowed. To be shown on light contact and to be led by an adult. To be shown at a walk, on the right rein, to line up and stand quietly. Ponies will be called out individually to stand, walk out and trot or jog back past the judge. Ponies to be judged on manners, suitability, breed type, conformation and turnout. There are no restrictions on competing in other divisions or classes for the pony or rider. This is not an equitation class.

WPCSA CHILD'S FIRST PONY (Article 115.2)

Section A, B, C and Half-Welsh, mare or gelding 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitors at least four, but not more than 10, years of age. Riders to be suitably dressed in Hunt, Saddle or Western attire including protective headgear. Ponies to be shown at a walk and trot or jog, both ways of the ring. Ponies to be judged on performance, manners and suitability. Conformation, way of going, and turnout to be emphasized. This is not an equitation class.

WPCSA TRAIL (Article 115.3)

English or Western equipment. Open to all ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. To be shown over and through obstacles at a walk, optional trot or jog and optional canter or lope. To be judged 100% on performance. Juniors will not side pass nor lope/canter over loose rails.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk-trot, and leadline walk-trot poles.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK-TROT (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk and trot. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk, and leadline walk-trot poles.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK-TROT POLES (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To be ridden once around a course of four poles on the ground entirely at a walk or entirely at a trot/jog. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk, and leadline walk-trot.

WPCSA WALK (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To walk both ways of the ring. English or Western attire is acceptable. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk-trot, walk-trot poles.

WPCSA WALK-TROT (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. Possible test to include: walk, trot/jog, turn, halt and rein back at spots marked. English or Western attire is acceptable. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk, walk-trot poles.

WPCSA WALK-TROT POLES (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To be ridden once around over a course of four poles on the ground entirely at a walk or trot. May be ridden at either a walk or trot. English or Western attire is acceptable. Rider ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk, walk-trot.

WPCSA SHOWMANSHIP (Article 115.6)

Classes should be offered for exhibitors 12 & under and 13-17 years of age. Judged on presentation and showman's ability to show his/her pony/cob. 40% of the judging is on neatness and appearance of the showman, pony and tack. 60% will be based on the exhibitor's ability to present his/her pony/cob. Either a pattern will be posted one hour prior to the class or the exhibitors will be informed of the judges choice of pattern before entering the ring.

WPCSA RIDDEN COB WELSH CLASSIC SEC. C & D (Article 115.7)

This class is for registered Welsh Cobs and Welsh Ponies of Cob Type 4 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on performance and 50% on conformation. To be shown at the walk, trot, canter and gallop, displaying Welsh movement as described in the breed description. An individual performance showing all gaits on each rein by each participant will be required (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped for conformation judging. UK Judge or qualified American Judge to officiate.

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC SEC. A & B (Article 115.8)

This class is for registered Welsh Ponies, Section A & B, 4 year of age and over. To be judged 50% on performance and 50% on conformation. To be shown at the walk, trot, canter and gallop, displaying Welsh movement as described in the breed description. An individual performance showing all gaits on each rein by each participant will be required (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped for conformation judging. UK Judge or qualified American Judge to officiate.
