SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

This show is conducted in accordance with the rules of the Welsh Pony & Cob Society of America. Each participant in this show is responsible for the knowledge of and is subject to these rules.

- 1. Eligibility:** All Ponies/Cobs must be registered in the studbook of the Welsh Pony & Cob Society of America, or, if under one year, be eligible for registration. A Pony/Cob must be shown under its full registered Welsh name and number. All lease agreements must be officially recorded through the Society office. All recorded leases are designated as such on the animal's Certificate of Registration. Leased animals being shown must present a copy of registration listing the lessee.
- 2. Measurement:** All halter animals 6 years and over, and all performance animals must present a copy of a WPCSA or USEF permanent measurement card or measurement conducted during the current competition year, or be measured. Measurement to Thursday at 1PM—3PM or by appointment
- 3. Exhibitors, parents and/or guardians of minor exhibitors** shall indemnify and hold harmless the Welsh Pony and Cob Association, Southwest Welsh Exhibitors and LA County Fairgrounds Fairgrounds, their officers, employees and/or all horse show officials and employees from any and all liability resulting in injury and/or loss sustained by any person, child or ward of such parent/guardian, in any manner occasioned.
- 4. Entries:** Copy of BOTH sides of the registration papers MUST accompany each entry. If you have a current measurement card, include a copy of it. Exhibitor numbers will not be issued until ALL paperwork is in order, and any measuring required has been completed. PLEASE take the time to fill out your entry form correctly and completely.
- 5. Driving:** For animals in harness, animals must be fully bridled while hitching and unhitching. Removing the bridle from an animal harnessed to a vehicle, or leaving an animal unattended while hitched, anywhere on the show grounds, will result in instant elimination and removal from the show grounds.
- 6. All riders in any class where jumping is required and/or when jumping anywhere on the show grounds, must wear protective headgear.** ALL JUNIORS must wear properly fitted headgear with chin harness secured, at all times whenever mounted or in a driven vehicle at all times on the show ground. Anyone violating this rule will be prohibited from further riding until in compliance. NOTE: Protective headgear is advised and welcome in all classes of any age group, with no judging penalties.
- 7. Stake Classes:** To qualify for entry, exhibitors must enter and compete in at least one other class in the division. All stake/jackpot will pay \$15 to first place, \$5 to second place. Classes with less than 3 entries: \$10. to first place.
- 8. Post Entry Rules:** Post entries and changes will only be accepted up to the end of the previous session. Pre-entries are strongly encouraged.
- 9. All dogs must be on leash or secured at all times.**
- 10. Juniors are NOT allowed to show or handle stallions anywhere on the fairgrounds.**
- 11. Payment of Fees:** A completed and signed check must accompany entries. Returned checks will be subject to a \$25 fee and must be cleared within 30 days of the last day of the show, or disciplinary actions will be sought through the WPCSA. Refund Policy: No refunds will be given unless a class is canceled, or upon presentation of a Vet Certificate or Doctor's note. The Show Committee's discretion will be used in other instances. **Decisions of Show Management are final.**
- 12. ANY** abuse toward any animal or Show Official/Staff will be cause for immediate ejection from the show and premises, **WITHOUT REFUND.**
- 13. Management reserves unto itself the right** to refuse or cancel any entries, disqualify riders, drivers or exhibitors without incurring claim for damages. Classes will be split where entries warrant. Decisions of the Show Management are final.
- 14. Two (2) Minute Gate Rule:** To be strictly enforced. Additional three (3) minutes will be allowed for requested tack change. The Gate will not be held for more than five (5) minutes.
- 15. Wire Wheeled vehicles** will be allowed in WPCSA Carriage Driving and WPCSA Pleasure Driving classes.

17. **PRIZES:** Ribbons 1st to 5th place. Awards to 1st place. Ribbons to Supreme & Division Champions.

18. **DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIPS:** In case of a tie, (except hunter) it shall be settled by ride/drive off. In case of a tie in the hunter division, the championship or reserve will be awarded to the animal that accumulated the most points over fences. If animals have an equal number of points over fences, they must be shown at a walk, trot and canter using the same judging specifications as in the classes offered in the division. No championship points can be awarded in any division unless all three of the scheduled classes in that division have been held. All three of the WPCSA division classes must have three or more exhibitors showing in each class for championship points to be awarded. Points for championships will be calculated as follows for all performance divisions: 1st – 5 points, 2nd – 3 points, 3rd - 2 points, 4th – 1 point.

Class Specifications

WPCSA BREED CLASSES (Article 110.2)

Animals are to be shown in hand at a walk and a trot except in group classes. Purebred Welsh to be judged 85% on breed type, conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on disposition and manners. Natural reaching action is desired. Half-Welsh to be judged 85% on conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on Welsh breed type, disposition and manners.

WPCSA WELSH ENGLISH PLEASURE (Article 112.3)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring on light contact without martingale. To be judged 75% on performance, manners movement and style: 25 % on breed type and conformation. Working classes to be judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA WELSH WESTERN PLEASURE (Article 112.4)

To be shown at a walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring without martingale on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. To be judged on performance, with emphasis on manners 65%; on breed type, movement and conformation 25%; appointments 10%. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA WELSH HUNTER (Article 112.5)

Over fences(o/f): To be shown over a course of a minimum of six fences with eight jumping efforts of the required height. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes judged 100% on performance. Animals not exceeding 13.2 hands will jump 2'0", animals exceeding 13.2 but not over 14.2 hands shall jump 2'6". Animals exceeding 14.2 hands jump 2'9". Under saddle(u/s): To be eligible, pony must have shown in and completed an over fences class. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. **May be required to gallop one way of the ring, but no more than eight animals at one time.**

WPCSA SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER (Article 112.6)**

Division is open to riders 12 years and under. Classes are open to all ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Riders in this division, including the under saddle class, may not compete over fences in any other division except Short Stirrup equitation. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. May either trot or canter the entire course. Over-fences classes must precede the under-saddle class. To be judged 100% on performance. To be eligible for the under-saddle class, pony must be entered and complete a course in at least one over-fence class. Under-saddle class animals shown both ways of ring at a walk, trot and canter.

WPCSA LONG STIRRUP HUNTER (Article 116.1) **

Division is open to riders 13 to 17 and 18 and over. Classes are open to all ponies/cobs half-Welsh. Riders in this division may not compete over fences in any other division except long stirrup equitation. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences and eight jumping efforts required. Over-fence class must precede the under-saddle class. To be judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA PLEASURE DRIVING (Article 113.1)

To be shown to a suitable two or four-wheeled vehicle or four-wheeled vehicle for pairs, but not a viceroy, racing sulky or fine harness rig. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, working trot and trot on and stand quietly and except for tandems, **to back readily**. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA CARRIAGE DRIVING (Article 113.2)

(wire wheeled vehicles can be used if stated in prize list.) In addition to the gaits detailed in the pleasure driving section (Article 113.1), carriage driving also requires the slow trot which is slower and more collected but not to the degree required in the dressage collected trot. The animal should indicate a willingness to be driven on the bit while maintaining a steady cadence. Turnout to be judged 40% on performance, manners and way of going; 30% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle; 15% on neatness and appropriateness of attire; and 15% on overall impression. Working class to be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going; 20% on condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire. Obstacle/Cones to be Judged 100% on performance. Rules for obstacle/cones need to be added to prize list. Carriage Driving Working Pattern/Test to be judged 60% on execution of test or pattern, 20% on manners and way of going, 20% on condition and fit of harness, vehicle and neatness of attire.

WPCSA LEADING REIN (Article 115.1)

Section A or B, C or Half-Welsh, mare or gelding, 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitors at least four, but not more than eight, years of age. The leading rein to be attached to the cavesson on the English bridle and on the Western bridle to the cheek slot of the bit (top of the bit) while leaving control of the pony to the child. No chain leadlines allowed. To be shown on light contact and to be led by an adult. To be shown at a walk, on the right rein, to line up and stand quietly. Ponies will be called out individually to stand, walk out and trot or jog back past the judge. Ponies to be judged on manners, suitability, breed type, conformation and turnout. There are no restrictions on competing in other divisions or classes for the pony or rider. This is not an equitation class.

WPCSA CHILD'S FIRST PONY (Article 115.2)

Section A, B, C and Half-Welsh, mare or gelding 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitors at least four, but not more than 10, years of age. Riders to be suitably dressed in Hunt, Saddle or Western attire including protective headgear. Ponies to be shown at a walk and trot or jog, both ways of the ring. Ponies to be judged on performance, manners and suitability. Conformation, way of going, and turnout to be emphasized. This is not an equitation class.

WPCSA TRAIL (Article 115.3)

English or Western equipment. Open to all ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. To be shown over and through obstacles at a walk, optional trot or jog and optional canter or lope. To be judged 100% on performance. Juniors will not side pass nor lope/canter over loose rails.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk-trot, and leadline walk-trot poles.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK-TROT (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk and trot. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk, and leadline walk-trot poles.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK-TROT POLES (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To be ridden once around a course of four poles on the ground entirely at a walk or entirely at a trot/jog. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk, and leadline walk-trot.

WPCSA WALK (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To walk both ways of the ring. English or Western attire is acceptable. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk-trot, walk-trot poles.

WPCSA WALK-TROT (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. Possible test to include: walk, trot/jog, turn, halt and rein back at spots marked. English or Western attire is acceptable. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk, walk-trot poles.

WPCSA WALK-TROT POLES (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To be ridden once around over a course of four poles on the ground entirely at a walk or trot. May be ridden at either a walk or trot. English or Western attire is acceptable. Rider ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk, walk-trot.

WPCSA SHOWMANSHIP (Article 115.6)

Classes should be offered for exhibitors 12 & under and 13-17 years of age. Judged on presentation and showman's ability to show his/her pony/cob. 40% of the judging is on neatness and appearance of the showman, pony and tack. 60% will be based on the exhibitor's ability to present his/her pony/cob. Either a pattern will be posted one hour prior to the class or the exhibitors will be informed of the judges choice of pattern before entering the ring.

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC SEC. C & D (Article 115.7) **

This class is for registered Welsh Cobs and Welsh Ponies of Cob Type 4 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on performance and 50% on conformation. To be shown at the walk, trot, canter, displaying Welsh movement as described in the breed description. An individual performance showing all gaits in both directions by each participant will be required (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped for conformation judging. Once an entry has been judged for conformation it can be retacked. UK Judge or qualified American Judge to officiate.

WPCSA RIDDEN WELSH CLASSIC SEC. A&B (Article 115.8) **

This class is for registered Welsh Ponies, Section A & B, 4 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on performance and 50% on conformation. To be shown at the walk, trot, canter, displaying Welsh movement as described in the breed description. An individual performance showing all gaits in both directions by each participant will be required (the gallop need only be shown in one direction). Each animal will then be stripped for conformation judging. Once an entry has been judged for conformation it can be retacked. UK Judge or qualified American Judge to officiate.

WPCSA OBSTACLE/CONES DRIVING:

WPCSA Obstacle - Time Competition. Not to exceed 20 obstacles (pairs of cones topped with tennis balls). Faults add seconds to total time. Fastest time wins.

1. To be driven over a prescribed course of obstacles. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area. Not to exceed 20 obstacles.
2. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle in order to the designated finish line.
3. Course faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis. Ties for first will be decided by a drive-off.
4. Penalties: a) Exceeding time allowed (every commenced second) 0.5 second b) Knocking over start or finish marker 5 seconds c) Knocking down or dislodging obstacle 5 seconds d) Break in gait 1st break from trot 5 seconds 2nd break from trot 5 seconds 3rd break from trot 5 seconds 4th break from trot Elimination Prolonged canter or walk Elimination e) Disobedience and/or groom dismounting (cumulative over course) 1st incident 5 seconds 2nd incident 10 seconds 3rd incident Elimination f) Starting before signal Elimination g) Failure to cross starting line within one minute of signal Elimination h) Off course Elimination i) Exceeding time limit (2X time allowed) Elimination j) Outside assistance Elimination k) Failure to carry whip Elimination l) Use of a tie-down or overcheck Elimination m) Breakage of harness or vehicle Elimination
